The Challenge is open to all members of the Cider Workshop Google Group - with the exception of Neil of Orchard Eye (sorry Neil, you'd probably beat us all anyway!)

Rules, Rules, Rules... Sorry, we have to have some.

This competition is being run in the same spirit as the group is run. So:

1. No nicking images. This means both entering photographs or images that are not your own AND taking photographs from the pool and using them without permission of the original photographer. The Flickr account has an 'All Rights Reserved' setting, which means that the photographer retains ownership and rights of the photograph/image.

2. Aside rule 1, by entering an image you are granting the Cider Workshop permission to display it... albeit that this is not for profit.

3. Should your photograph be of a person who is recognisable (i.e. you can see their face) and/or a business other than your own, please would you ask their permission

to enter it. Its fairly dodgy ground, and its only polite. We will allow entries of other people etc. on the assumption that you have asked, but will check where required.

4. No smut. Please don't enter obscene or offensive images. We will remove them. And no, 'art' is not an excuse!

5. Judgements are final. Neil is a professional which is why we asked him to judge. All the admins are doing is uploading/making sure entries are in the right place. Outside of these rules, Neil has the final say!
